BYELAWS for the prevention of danger, obstruction or annoyance to persons bathing in sea or using the seashore, made by the Council of the Borough of Cleethorpes in pursuance of Section 76 of the Public Health Act 1961.

### Extent of Byelaw

1. These byelaws shall apply to the seashore within the Borough of Cleethorpes between the northernmost point of the North Promenade, Cleethorpes and the Sewage Outfall Pumping Station and also between Anthony's Bank, Cleethorpes and the Humber Mouth Yacht Club, Humberston and therefrom for a distance seaward of 200 metres from ordinary high water mark of medium spring tides.

### Definitions

2. In these byelaws: -

- a) 'Council' means the Council of the Borough of Cleethorpes.
- b) 'Navigator' means the person who whether as owner or otherwise has charge or control of a pleasure boat and includes a person who, being present, is entitled to give orders to the person having charge or control.

### Due Care and Attention

3. No person, being the Navigator of a pleasure boat, shall cause or suffer such vessel to be driven or sailed in a dangerous manner or without due care and attention or without reasonable consideration for other persons.

### Speed Limits

4. No person, being the Navigator of a pleasure boat, shall during the months of April to October inclusive cause or suffer such vessel to exceed a speed of eight (8) knots through the water. PROVIDED THAT this byelaw shall not apply to any vessel taking part in an event organised by the Council or by any other person or body with the consent of the said Council in writing. AND PROVIDED ALSO that this byelaw shall not apply to that area 120 metres wide which lies between an imaginary line extending seawards in a north easterly direction for a distance of 200 metres from the yellow marker post on the third groyne on the south side of the Cleethorpes Pier and a parallel imaginary line extending seawards for a distance of 200 metres from the yellow marker post on the fifth groyne on the south side of the Cleethorpes Pier.

Silencer

5. No person, being the Navigator of a pleasure boat propelled by an internal combustion engine, shall use the pleasure boat unless the engine is fitted with a silencer suitable and sufficient for reducing as far as may be reasonable the noise caused by the escape of the exhaust gasses from the engine.

Penalty

6. Any person offending against any of the foregoing byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds amended on the fifteenth day of March, 1979.

Saving as to Crown Rights

7. Nothing contained in any of the foregoing byelaws shall be deemed to be or shall operate as a grant by or on behalf of the Crown as owner of the foreshore and seabed below high water mark of any estate or interest in or right over such foreshore and seabed, or any part thereof, nor shall anything contained in or done under any of the provisions of the foregoing byelaws in any respect prejudice or injuriously affect the rights and interests of the Crown in such foreshore and seabed, or prevent the exercise thereon of any public rights or prejudice or injuriously affect any right, power or privilege legally exercisable in, over and in respect of the foreshore and seabed.
