Parents or Young People may disagree with a local authority, education provider or health authority about the provision they offer, or with a decision around an Education Health Care (EHC) plan.

A disagreement can be stressful and, the longer it goes on, the more it can affect the education of a young person or child.

Disagreement Resolution and Mediation can help.



What are the benefits?

Independent....

The mediator is independent from others involved in a dispute. They are there simply to help a conversation.

You are in control....

The agreements you reach are based on your ideas of what works for you / your child. Decisions are in your hands.

Timely....

A mediator will contact you within 5 working days, so the process can begin quickly.

It de-escalates tensions....

...and helps maintain or re-establish working relationships.

Accessible financially....

It is offered and paid for by the local authority.

Another option....

It simply offers you another way of resolving a dispute, where you may have considered only more formal options such as complaints processes / tribunals.

What happens in Disagreement Resolution / Mediation?

Disagreement Resolution (DR) and Mediation both involve a Mediator.

A mediator will listen to your concerns and find out what is important to you. They will talk to you about DR / Mediation and whether it is something you would like to try. These conversations are confidential. This conversation is sometimes called ***Mediation Advice.***

If you decide to go ahead, the mediator will contact others involved in the dispute and schedule a joint meeting in a neutral location where everyone involved can work towards resolving the problems.
